Boris is a 3 year old male neutered Golden Doodle.

Earlier this year, Boris was diagnosed with Oesophageal dysfunction. This means that he can regurgitate his food and has a high risk of aspiration pneumonia. Currently Boris has a routine in place which manages his condition which includes things such as;

- Medication to prevent acid reflux
- A strict feeding routine which involves him being fed in a certain way at set times. This routine can take up to 45 minutes to an hour twice daily and involves his food being ground and soaked.
- A strict regime and guide for play time as he can only manage very gentle games with toys. He must not scavenge and has been trained to be comfortable wearing a Baskerville muzzle whilst on walks to prevent him eating anything he shouldn't.
- Hydrotherapy to keep his core strong and physiotherapy to ensure he does not get back issues from the way in which he is required to eat.

We are looking for a very special home for Boris. We're specifically looking for someone who meets the following requirements:

- No small children, no cats and preferably no other dogs
- Someone that is home most of the day and might have experience of this condition or one similar.

Boris' rehoming is quite a unique case and because he needs dedicated and specialist care we will be willing to look outside our normal rehoming radius'.
