Partnership story

Jackie and canine partner Kingston

Jackie was partnered with black Labrador, Kingston, in 2015. This is her story.

"After leaving college, I served as a police officer in the Metropolitan Police for nearly six years until a traumatic brain injury at work left me with epilepsy. In 2007, I was diagnosed with Cauda Equina Syndrome and Spinal Stenosis, leading to severe spinal cord compression. Despite two emergency surgeries, I was left with severe lower body weakness, requiring the use of a wheelchair.

"My life changed overnight, plunging me into deep depression. I was in constant pain and dependent on others for daily tasks, making life unbearable. Despite appearing cheerful, I was in a very dark place.



"I first learned about Canine Partners in 2010 but didn't apply as I didn't think I was disabled enough. Later, I saw a demonstration of these amazing dogs, convincing me that a canine partner could improve my life.

"In 2015, Canine Partners called to tell me they had found a match – a black Labrador named Kingston.

"We bonded instantly, and after our two-week training course, Kingston became my lifechanging companion. I can't thank Canine Partners enough for bringing him into my life."

With Kingston, my confidence soared.
 I travelled independently, volunteered with a local disability organisation, and participated in NHS projects.

"Kingston helped me with daily tasks like retrieving dropped items, assisting with dressing, and even alerting me to impending epileptic seizures and diabetic emergencies, which was not taught by Canine Partners. He saved my life multiple times, including summoning help when I fell. Kingston's devotion earned him a special PDSA award for heroism. "Kingston's presence not only transformed my life but gave me a new one filled with hope, love, and adventure."

After being by Jackie's side for nearly nine years, Kingston sadly passed away in July 2024.

"He was my best friend, hero, and angel in a fur coat. There are not enough thank yous in the world that I can give Kingston."

In September 2024, Kingston was awarded the 'Animal Award' at the BBC London *Make a Difference* Awards.

"Winning the award is better than winning the National Lottery. Kingston made me visible in a society which made me invisible. The day he passed away, that invisibility came back.

"He put joy in my heart and gave me the biggest gift of all – the gift of independence. I still go out and have his lead on my chair. He was one in a million, I miss him."

Supporting your dog through fireworks

With Bonfire Night, Diwali, and New Year's Eve approaching, fireworks can be stressful for many dogs.

Here are some tips for supporting your dog during this time

Recognising signs of stress

Look out for signs of fear or anxiety in your dog during fireworks:

- trembling or shaking
- restlessness and pacing
- destructive behaviour
- hiding
- panting or lip smacking
- seeking attention
- whining or barking
- attempts to escape
- loss of house training
- reluctance to go outside
- vomiting or diarrhoea

Getting your dog used to the noise

Help your dog get used to firework sounds in advance by playing simulated firework sounds at a low volume. Reward calm behaviour while gradually increasing the volume.



Preparing your dog for firework nights

Ensure your dog gets a good walk beforehand. We recommend feeding your dog earlier than usual to allow them to relieve themselves before the fireworks start.

Prepare a quiet, dark space where your dog can seek comfort, and have essential supplies ready so you can stay home with your dog. Keeping your curtains closed and playing music or having the TV on can help reduce noise and visual stress.

After the fireworks

Allow your dog to leave their safe spot when they feel ready and avoid making a big deal about the fireworks ending. If your dog is reluctant to go outside afterwards, use treats and positive reinforcement to encourage them and rebuild positive associations.

Unexpected fireworks might occur before and after the main fireworks nights, so consider keeping your dog on a lead on walks during this period. Make sure your dog is wearing a collar with an ID tag.

If your dog has a severe reaction to fireworks, you should seek advice from your Canine Partners representative or vet.

Meet Puppy Parent volunteer Charleigh

At 22, university student Charleigh has just begun her third adventure as a Puppy Parent volunteer to a gorgeous chocolate Labrador.

In 2021, Charleigh welcomed her first puppy into her home, an eight-week-old black Labrador. This year, she completed her nurturing duties for a Labrador X Golden Retriever who went on to be partnered in August.

As she embraces her next puppy trainee, Charleigh hopes her story will inspire other students to consider taking on this unique and fulfilling role. For Charleigh, being a Puppy Parent volunteer is more than just a volunteer opportunity – it's an experience that has significantly enriched her university life in unexpected ways.

"Even though I'm ultimately helping someone else, there's no underestimating how the dogs have helped me in return."

"I feel much more confident when I have the puppy with me. People stop and talk to me, and I feel at ease. I've even gone out on a date with a puppy by my side, which helped ease my nerves tremendously!" Charleigh has always adored dogs, but she couldn't commit to owning a dog full-time as a university student. Becoming a Puppy Parent volunteer was the perfect solution. Each week with a puppy involves teaching basic commands, socialising in different environments, and ensuring the puppy is exposed to various sights, sounds, and situations.

"A lot of people ask how I can give up a puppy after raising it for a year, but from the start, you know they are not yours, and they are going to go on to do something really wonderful."

Charleigh and her partner, John, pictured left and right, loving their invaluable role as Puppy Parent volunteers. "It's not easy to say goodbye, but it's worth it when you see how they can transform someone's life."

As she prepares to welcome her third puppy, Charleigh is excited to continue this unique journey, knowing that each week brings new challenges, learning experiences, and plenty of puppy love.

Doggy delights

Keeping your dog entertained indoors

Having fun with food enrichment toys

You might be spending more time indoors during the winter months, so it's important to ensure your dog has plenty to do. Food enrichments toys can be a fantastic way to give your dog a mental and physical challenge while also providing them with a tasty treat.

They provide a huge amount of enrichment for your dog and can be used to encourage settling behaviour or as an alternative way to feed your dog their normal food (great for fast feeders!).



Top tip: Freeze treats Soak your dog's biscuits in warm water. Once the water has been absorbed,

mash it together, then fill

the toy and freeze.





Recipe ideas

Our Canine Partners experts have provided some great recipes for a special treat that your four-legged friend will love. Mix the following ingredients, then fill the toy and freeze.

Breakfast

Mix banana, berries, yogurt, and oats.

Under the sea

Mix cooked salmon, white fish, sweet potato, and kale.

Banana cheesecake

Layer crushed dog biscuits, squeezy cheese, and mashed banana.

Pumpkin pie

Mix cooked pumpkin, carrot, peas, and dried meat.

These recipes are suitable for a fit and healthy dog. However, they may not be suitable for your dog due to health concerns or age. If you're unsure about any ingredient, please check with your Canine Partners representative or vet before giving it to your dog.

Partnership story

René and canine partner Paz

René was partnered with a black Labrador X Golden Retriever called Paz in 2020. This is her story.

"I have a type of Scleroderma called Systemic Sclerosis. The condition attacks my immune system and all the connective tissue in my body, both internally and externally. It has impacted every aspect of my life since I was diagnosed at the age of 19.

"Living with this condition has left me with 2% mobility in my hands and 15% mobility throughout my entire body. I often experience discomfort and limited hand mobility, especially in cold weather. Paz's presence has been invaluable in helping me with these challenges, allowing me to maintain a sense of independence.

"I have been incredibly fortunate to have Paz by my side for the last four years. He's been a massive help in easing my mobility challenges. As well as being a great companion, Paz helps me with daily tasks like opening and closing doors, doing laundry, and picking up things I drop.



"Our bond is undeniable. Paz has made such a significant impact on my life, and I'm incredibly grateful for his companionship and support. He's brought so much joy and independence back into my world, and I can't imagine life without him.

"Last year, I retired after 35 years as a mental health professional. I now actively participate in events to raise awareness for Canine Partners, where I can share my story and advocate for the incredible work of this charity. I'm so thankful to Canine Partners for partnering us and giving me the most incredible canine partner."

It was a privilege for Paz and me to go to Westminster to raise awareness and campaign for better access for people who rely on assistance dogs. The MPs and Minister Mims Davies showed genuine interest and were surprised by all the amazing things Paz does for me.





Earlier this year, Canine Partners joined other Assistance Dogs UK (ADUK) and Assistance Dogs International (ADI) charities at a Westminster event to demonstrate the life-changing impact of assistance dogs across the UK. René, attended the event alongside Paz. With Paz by my side, I love meeting new people, doing new things and challenging myself. I enjoy public speaking, especially when I get to show off my handsome boy, Paz and all the incredible things he does for me.

"Sharing my experiences with access refusals was eye-opening for many MPs, who said they found it enlightening."

Canine Partners is a member of ADUK, a voluntary coalition of accredited assistance dog charities that seeks to advance the education of the public and service providers about assistance dogs and the rights of people who rely on them.

We collaborate closely with fellow ADUK member organisations to share knowledge, expertise, and skills to achieve best practices and provide the highest level of care for the people we support and the amazing dogs they're partnered with.
